Locking Your Tablet

Security is an important issue for any computing device, and this applies to physical security as much as online security. For Android tablets it is possible to place a digital lock on the screen, so that only an authorized user can open it. This is useful when there are several user accounts on the same tablet. There are different ways in which a lock can be set:


1 Tap on the Settings app



In the **Personal** section, tap on the **Security** option



The current method of **Screen lock** is displayed here. Tap on this to access the options



The methods for locking the screen are None, Swipe, Pattern, PIN and Password. Tap on the required method to select it and set its attributes



The **Swipe** option is the least secure (after **None**) as it only requires the padlock icon to be swiped to the edge of the circle to unlock the tablet. No other security authorization is required




The Swipe option is only really useful for avoiding items being activated accidentally when your tablet is not in use; it is not a valid security method. The most secure method is a password containing letters, numbers and characters.



For the **PIN** (or **Password**) option, enter the PIN in the box and tap on the **Continue** button. Enter the PIN again for confirmation. This will then need to be entered whenever you want to unlock the tablet



For the **Pattern** option, drag over the keypad to create the desired pattern, then press Continue and enter again to confirm





Whenever your tablet goes to sleep it will need to be unlocked before you can use it again. Sleep mode can be activated by pressing the On/Off button once. After a period of inactivity the tablet will also go into Sleep mode automatically: the length of time until this happens can be specified within **Settings** > **Display**

> Sleep.
